General paper Logic quiz 24

Read the following information carefully and answer the questions that follow

The solar year is 365 days, 5 hours, 48 minutes and 46 seconds. The year not being exact divisible by months and days, the practice arose out of marking arbitrary divisions and inserting extra days. The Gregorian calendar in use today uses the same trick to "catch up" with the solar year. Hence the months of April, June, September and November have 30 days while January, March, May, July, August, October and December have 31days. February has 28 days in ordinary years and 29 in a Leap year.

Since the ancient times, the days and months in a year have been associated with the movement of the stars and their placement in heavens. Through careful observation and study of stars and planets, diviners called astrologers were able to forecast supposed influences of stars and planets on human affairs according to the seasons. This later developed into present day "horoscope" or "Your stars". The horoscope is a diagram of the relative positions of planets and signs of the Zodiac at specific time (as at ones birth) for use by astrologers in inferring individual character and personality traits and foretelling events of a person's life.

All this seems to control the life of Mzee Byarufu; an illiterate man living in the village of Kikongi. In his culture, it is believed that one's character and life are determined and influence by the time of birth. Mzee Byarufu has led a very troubled life full of misfortunes. Being illiterate, he does not know when he was born. All he knows is that he was born the day after Christmas celebrations in the year World War II ended. On the day he was born, his father died while on his way back from the frontline in Burma. His body was never returned for proper burial among his ancestors. Mzee Byarufu has been told that all his misfortune are either related to the day of his birth or are a result of unperformed rituals relating to the death of his father. On the day he turned 13 years, his mother followed her husbands to the grave. He later married and

produced several children, half of whom perished in an accident exactly on one of his birthdays. Mzee Byarufu has since become superstitious. He associates certain misfortune to dates, numbers and numerous omens. He has been assured by witch doctors and astrologers that unless the exact date, day of the week, month and year of his birth are discovered, his misfortunes would never end.

Questions

- (a) Using today's modern calendar, help Mzee Byarufu find out the date, day of the week, month and year in which:
 - (i) He was born
 - (ii) His mother died (show your working) (18 marks))
- (b) Mzee Byarufu got married at 18 years and produced children every other year until he was 30 years old. On his 31st birthday, some of his children perished in a road accident while coming from a party.
 - (i) How many children did he:
 - Have by the age of 30 years?
 - Remain with after accident (06 marks)
 - (ii) Identify the year in which Mzee Byarufu produced his last child (02 marks)

Suggested answer

- (a) Using today's modern calendar, help Mzee Byarufu find out the date, day of the week, month and year in which:
 - (i) He was born

He was born of 26th December 1945

Finding the day of the week

Use the following tables

Month codes

Month	J	F	М	Α	М	J	J	Α	S	0	N	D
code	0	3	3	6	1	4	6	2	5	0	3	5

Century code

Procedure

Find the Sum = day of the week + month code + century code + last two digits of the year + a quarter of the last two digits of the year disregarding the decimal places

For 26th Dec 1945

Divide the sum by 7 and take the remainder only

= 56/7 = remainder 0 (corresponding to the day of the week)

Therefore 26th December 1945 was a Sunday

Hence Mzee Byarufu was born on Sunday 26th December 1945

For a leap year, subtract 1 from the final answer if the month is Jan or Feb.

Examples for practice

Find the day of the week for

a. 2nd march 1999

$$Sum = 2 + 3 + 0 + 99 + 24 = 128$$

The remainder when the sum is divided by 7 = 2 or Tuesday

b. 5th Feb 2000

$$Sum = 5 + 3 + 6 + 00 + 00 = 14$$

The remainder when the sum is divided by 7 = 0 (or Sunday)
2000 being a leap year the right is the day before Sunday which Saturday

(ii) His mother died

(show your working)

(18 marks)

His mother died 13 years later after his birth = 1945+ 13 = 1958

Hence his mother died on 26th Dec. 1958

Finding the day of the week

Sum =
$$26 + 5 + 0 + 58 + 8$$
 (58/7 discarding remainder)
= 97

Sum/7 = remainder 6 (Saturday)

Hence the mother died on Saturday 26 December 1958

c. Mzee Byarufu got married at 18 years and produced children every other year until he was 30 years old. On his 31st birthday, some of his children perished in a road accident while coming from a party.

Number of children born = 1 at 19, 1 at 21, 1 at 23, 1 at 25, 1 at 27,

- (iii) How many children did he:
 - Have by the age of 30 years?
 - Number of children born = 1 at 19, 1 at 21, 1 at 23, 1 at 25, 1 at 27,

= 5

- Remain with after accident

(06 marks)

Total number of chidren at 31 = 5 + 1 at 31 = 6

After the accident a half of the children perished remaining with 3

(iv) Identify the year in which Mzee Byarufu produced his last child (02 marks)

The year in which Mzee Byarufu produced the last child = 1945 +31

= 1976

d. What are the problems which are likely to be faced by superstitious people like Mzee Byarufu? (10 marks)

Superstition can lead to various problems, including:
