## Contributions Britain to downfall of Emperor Napoleon 1

Britain played a crucial role in the downfall of Napoleon I through several key contributions:

- Naval Superiority: The British Royal Navy's dominance, particularly after the Battle of Trafalgar in 1805, prevented Napoleon from invading Britain and maintained a blockade that restricted French trade and military movements.

- 5. **Formation of Coalitions**: Britain was a key player in forming and leading the coalitions against Napoleon, including the Sixth Coalition that ultimately defeated him
