## Print Media Terms and Their Meanings

Word	Meaning
<b>Cartoon</b>	A drawing or comic strip that makes people laugh or teaches a lesson.
<b>Puzzle</b>	A game or activity in the paper that challenges the mind (e.g., riddles).
<b>Story</b>	A written account of events, either true or imaginary.
<b>News</b>	Information about current events happening locally or globally.
<b>Announcement</b>	A public notice that gives important information.
<b>Advertisement</b>	A message that promotes products, services, or events.
<b>Newspaper</b>	A printed publication with daily or weekly news, stories, and adverts.
<b>Magazine</b>	A printed publication with articles, pictures, and stories, often monthly.
<b>Back Page</b>	The last page of a newspaper or magazine.
<b>Front Page</b>	The first page, usually showing the most important news.
<b>Reporter</b>	A person who gathers and writes news stories.
<b>Article</b>	A piece of writing in a newspaper or magazine about a topic.
<b>Editorial</b>	An article that shows the opinion of the editor or newspaper.
<b>Columnist</b>	A writer who regularly writes a column (section) in a newspaper/magazine.
<b>Editor</b>	The person who checks and prepares articles before they are printed.
<b>Journalist</b>	A person who collects, writes, and reports news.
<b>Column</b>	A section of a newspaper or magazine where a writer shares ideas.
<b>Crossword</b>	A word puzzle where answers are written into a grid.
<b>Media</b>	All ways of sharing information (newspapers, TV, radio, internet).
<b>Brochure</b>	A small booklet with information about products, services, or events.
<b>Pullout</b>	A special section in a newspaper or magazine that can be removed.
<b>Newsletter</b>	A printed letter or booklet that gives updates to a group of people.

## Articles in English

In English grammar, **articles** are small words that come before nouns. They help us know whether we are talking about something **specific** or **general**.

### Types of Articles

#### 1. **Definite Article** → **the**

Use **the** when talking about something special or already mentioned: *the moon, the front page, the editor* Example: *I read **the** story in the newspaper.*

## 2. Indefinite Articles → a, an

Used when talking about something **general** or not specific.

**a** → before words that begin with a **consonant sound**.

Examples

- (i) I saw **a** dog.
- (ii) She bought **a** book.

**a** → is also used before words that start with a vowel but consonant sounds for example **a** Uniform and **a** University

**an** → before words that begin with a **vowel sound** (a, e, i, o, u).

Example:

- (i) He ate **an** apple.
- (ii) She read **an** article.

**an** → is also used before words that start with a consonant but vowel sounds for example **an honorable**

## Relative Pronouns

Relative pronouns are words that **join two sentences together** by referring to a noun mentioned earlier. They introduce a **relative clause** (extra information about the noun).

### Common Relative Pronouns

- **who** → refers to people
- **which** → refers to animals or things
- **that** → refers to people, animals, or things
- **whose** → shows possession (belongs to someone)
- **whom** → refers to people (formal, less common in Primary 5)

### Examples

1. The boy **who** won the race is my friend.
2. This is the car **which** has a new engine.
3. The bicycle **that** I bought yesterday is red.
4. The girl **whose** book is missing is looking sad.
5. The teacher **who** teaches us English is very kind.
